



ALUMNI WHO SPONSOR

Our "US Alumni" are a growing number of youth and young adults who traveled to Haiti with us to work with the students in Haiti. Many come home to sponsor a student at the schools saying, "Anything I could do to help even one student was worth it" (Marina C., 2014 alumna). One unique alumni experience comes from Abby T. (pictured above), one of the first alumni from a 2003 trip. Abby recently wrote a blog reflecting back on her Haiti experience. Here's an excerpt (full text available online):

"One of the best things I think any parent can teach their child is what these five-yearold children in Haiti, without even realizing, demonstrated so strongly for me. These kids truly appreciated everything they had, they did not take anything for granted, and were utterly thrilled with the most simple and simultaneously the most beautiful aspects of life; working together, and sharing, and making connections with others... I sponsored a student named Tamara soon after experiencing Haiti. She would have been in kindergarten when I was graduating high school.

I enjoyed receiving each yearly picture of Tamara as she progressed through school. (I noticed on her report cards that she did quite well, I might add). It is now gratifying and surprisingly weird to realize that Tamara is about to graduate high school and is the same age I was when I first sponsored her.

It is without a doubt that Tamara will take advantage of her diploma from Dr. Mortel's school, and will be one of the next strong, positive contributions to Haiti. This was Dr. Mortel's goal in creating such a school and he has the blessing of being able to see his hard work come to fruition, with the success of each graduating class, spreading like branches of a tree in which to give back to Haiti. No act of kindness goes unnoticed."

PRESCHOOL DEDICATION





January 2018 brought a group of Board members and supporters to celebrate the dedication ceremony of the Patricia Chairs Preschool in Saint Marc. Bishop Ronald Gainer of the Diocese of Harrisburg was the main celebrant, accompanied by a student choir and liturgical dancers from the Good Samaritans School as well as teachers and parents of the enthusiastic preschoolers!

The preschool building sits on the corner of the street in the heart of Saint Marc, a few doors down from the Good Samaritans primary school and serves 200 3- and 4 year olds in 4 classes of preschool.

A NOTE ON THE FAMILY **FOUNDATION**

When we launched the Mortel High Hopes for Haiti Foundation (Mortel HHH) in November of 2016, the Mortel Family Charitable Foundation (MFCF) didn't disappear! The MFCF is privately supported (as opposed to publicly like Mortel HHH) and will be undergoing some new initiatives in the years to come. While Mortel HHH will continue to support the classical education of the poorest of the poor in Haiti from Pre-K through 13th grade through our student sponsorship program and other efforts, MFCF will be branching into alternative educational opportunities such as a trade school, artisanship program, micro-lending, and agriculture training.
